



STOP JAPANESE ABDUCTION OF AMERICAN CHILDREN NOW!

According to the U.S. State Department, among non-Hague signatory countries, Japan is second in international child abductions.

After 27 years, Japan is still the only G7 nation that refuses to sign the Hague Convention on the civil aspects of international child abduction.

Not one child abducted to Japan has ever been returned through legal or diplomatic means.

We stand in solidarity with Japan against North Korea's disregard of human rights. However, the Government of Japan must address this critical issue of American children being abducted to Japan with no chance of return. Compare the facts:

JAPAN

Government Protected Abduction

CRC of Japan estimates that between 100-200 American children are abducted to, or retained in, Japan every year. It is estimated that over 10,000 child abductions to Japan are currently unresolved.

The Japanese Government ignores extradition requests and will not enforce arrest warrants issued for Japanese child abductors.

From 1980 to 2007, the Government of Japan has refused to return any abducted children to their countries of origin.

Japan does not recognize these abductions of children as a crime.

NORTH KOREA

Government Sponsored Abduction

From 1977 to 1983, 17 Japanese citizens were abducted to North Korea.

Despite requests by the Japanese Government, North Korea has denied the extradition of the abductors to Japan.

As of 2006, North Korea has returned five abductees to their families in Japan.

North Korea has admitted their crimes of abduction to the world.

Parental abduction is a felony crime in the United States, subject to imprisonment. Should we be doing business with a country that condones criminal behavior?
